
Site: Friendship Circle of Michigan

Specifically, the goal of this project was to enhance the curriculum of the programs by adding life skills lessons. Throughout my project, I worked on the Lessons for Life and summer camp programs.

Needs Assessment | Literature Review

Needs Assessment: Prior to beginning my capstone experience, Friendship Circle expressed that they could benefit from someone enhancing the curriculum for their Lessons for Life and summer camp programs.

<u>Literature Review:</u> Life skills programs can be successful in teaching children with disabilities, as well as improving their social skills. Summer camp programs are a great place for children with disabilities to work on goals or problem behaviors. Additionally, summer camps can also help children with disabilities improve their social skills.

The literature supports that life skills and summer camp programs are beneficial for children with disabilities. Occupational therapists can implement life skills within these programs, as this falls within their scope of practice.

Outcome Measure 1: In order to develop an in-depth knowledge in program development, student will demonstrate ability to enhance a life skills program for individuals with special needs.



- 4. Activity-based Outline with at least 10 activities for children to engage in during summer camp
- 5. Certificate of Completion for a leadership training course







Future Implications for OT

Impact on OT: Both the life skills curriculum and the summer camp curriculum incorporated principles of occupational therapy and will be available to the site to utilize with future participants. Impact on my career: My capstone project strengthened my desire to work with children throughout my future career.
