

Project Description & Sites

- **Areas of Study:** Program and Policy Development (1), Leadership (2), Administration (3)
- **Population:** Adults without health insurance, OTD/OTA students
- **Sites:** Huntington University OTD Campus and Matthew 25 Clinic
- **Description:** My doctoral capstone centered around developing a student-run occupational therapy pro bono clinic for adults who are either uninsured or underinsured in the local community. Throughout my project, I built community trust with Matthew 25 which blossomed into a partnership between Huntington University and Matthew 25 for an occupational therapy student-run clinic, allowing level 1 fieldwork opportunities for students. I created a Standard Operating Manual and an Event Plan to be implemented for the sustainability of the student-run clinic.



Needs Assessment | Literature Review

- **Needs Assessment:** I interviewed local Fort Wayne healthcare professionals about current payor sources/costs, distinct values of patients, and knowledge of occupational therapy. I also interviewed the Matthew 25 board of directors on current therapy needs. Lastly, I interviewed current HU OTD/OTA students about a student-run clinic.
- **Literature Review:** 43.4% of adults aged 19-64 in the United States were inadequately insured in 2020. 10.1% of Fort Wayne's population under 65 years are without health insurance. Some of the top health service needs as deemed by residents of Fort Wayne include mental health services, access to primary care providers, senior services, and health insurance. Current literature supports an impact on the students, patients, and university with a student run clinic. Students develop skills in interprofessional communication, self efficacy, conflict resolution, effective communication, and personal development.

Christ | Scholarship | Service

Project Completion and Outcomes

- **Outcome Measure 1:** Student will demonstrate knowledge of program and policy development by designing a Standard Operating Procedures Manual for a student-run OT clinic.
- **Related Learning Objectives:** Complete program management/leadership training, obtain 30 hours minimum of administrative observation, and interview 5 healthcare professionals.
- **Outcome Measure 2:** Student will design an event plan for a launching event for the student-run clinic to introduce the stake holders, future student leaders, and sustainable action plan for the impact on the individual participant, community members, university, and metropolitan area.
- **Related Learning Objectives:** Create structure student board, complete online engagement survey and present, create a budget plan, and create marketing materials.
