Project Description & Sites

Areas of Study: Education, Advocacy, Leadership

Population: Prospective occupational therapy students and pre-OT students.

Site: Illinois Occupational Therapy Association

Description: My doctoral capstone focused on advocating for increased diversity among prospective students. Throughout my project, I contributed to the Illinois Occupational Therapy Association's Pre-OT Mentorship Program through the creation of educational resources for pre-OT students.

Mission & Vision Statements

Project Mission Statement: To promote occupational therapy and increase awareness of the profession as a potential career.

Project Vision Statement: To create opportunities for students throughout the state of Illinois to interact with occupational therapy professionals to promote leadership and advocacy in the field of occupational therapy.

Project Completion and Outcomes

- ❖Outcome Measure 1: The student demonstrated an understanding of the role of an educator through the creation of a curriculum for mentors and mentees through middle and high school.
- ❖Related Learning Objectives: The student demonstrated increased knowledge in curriculum development as measured by creating an outline of articles/texts focusing on curriculum design.
- Outcome Measure 2: The student demonstrated an in-depth understanding of the qualities of a leader through the creation of educational leadership resources.
- ❖Related Learning Objectives: The student demonstrated increased knowledge of leadership principles as measured by the completion of at least 1 leadership continued education course.
- ❖Outcome Measure 3: In order to develop an in-depth knowledge of current advocacy efforts for occupational therapy, the student created a qualitative research survey that was able to give info and detail regarding the need for increased advocacy for OT as a career choice.
- ❖Related Learning Objectives: The student created an in-service to be provided to OTPs & students for the purposes of increasing awareness of DEI efforts.

Needs Assessment | Literature Review

Needs Assessment: I consulted with my expert mentor and other practitioners about the need for educational materials to support the Pre-OT Mentorship Program. Considering the vast diversity among clients, groups, and populations that occupational therapists interact with, understanding the need to diversify the profession is important.

Literature Review: According to the AOTA Workforce salary survey (2019), "3.1% of practicing occupational therapists are African American/Black, 3.2% are Hispanic/Latinx, and 85.3% are Caucasian/White" (p.7). A study completed by Collins & Carr (2018) examined barriers to considering occupational therapy as a career path. The most commonly cited reasons for not choosing occupational therapy were the lack of awareness, knowledge, and exposure to the field.

The current literature reflects that there needs to be better strategies and programs in place to recruit and retain students of diverse backgrounds to diversify the practitioners in our profession. The profession needs to be accessible to those who want to pursue occupational therapy as a career path.
